Traffic Calming in Our Neighborhood

In 2015, one of our Homeowners submitted a proposal for speed humps to assist in controlling traffic speeding on Fernwood Drive between El Verano and Brentwood Avenue. We are pleased to announce that the SFMTA is approving the request.

If any homeowners are interested in applying for traffic calming on another block in our neighborhood, please visit www.sfmta.com/node/77946. Residents can apply for speed humps to be added to their streets if they feel there is a speeding concern. Applications are evaluated based on criteria such as speeds, collisions, and volume. When there is significant speeding but speed humps cannot be installed, measures like median islands, chicanes, or traffic circles can be considered. Applications for the 2016/2017 Traffic Calming Program will be accepted starting February 2, 2016 and must be submitted by Monday, August 1, 2016.

Plant a Street Tree in Monterey Heights with Friends of the Urban Forest

Friends of the Urban Forest (FUF) is a non-profit organization that helps San Francisco residents get new trees on their blocks, at reduced cost. Thus far, FUF has worked with neighborhood communities to plant over 50,000 trees in San Francisco.

Why should you join with FUF in planting a tree? Street trees provide benefits such as: increasing property values, cleaning the air, preventing flooding, reducing crime, promoting exercise, absorbing traffic noise, calming traffic, increasing privacy, and building neighborhood and civic pride. Vin Debut Rises From the Ashes – by Marie-Cecile van de Lavoir

In 2010, my husband and I became members of the Vin Debut wine club. We always loved walking there on a Friday and tasting wines

before we picked up our bottles and went our merry way. Unfortunately, on October 12, 2012, disaster struck and Vin Debut went up in flames. Rebuilding efforts got underway and it has taken longer than we all hoped but finally, three years later, Vin Debut is up and running again. The owners James and Gail were determined to come back and hung in there for all that time and they (and we) are happy to be back.

The concept has changed from the original: what started as a wine store is now a full-fledged wine bar with a kitchen that serves small plates. In addition, there is an interesting selection of Californian draft beers with a few European ones sprinkled in and many more beers in bottles.

Due to ADA requirements, an elevator had to be put in to service the offices upstairs which significantly reduced the amount of wine storage space. As a result, the wine club is no more.

But first and foremost, Vin Debut is a wine bar and there are a lot of wines by the glass both from the Old and New Worlds. The categorization of the wine has stayed the same. Reds come in “soft,” “rounded” and “bold.” Whites come in “bright,” “aromatic” and “rich.” If you like what you taste, you can buy a bottle to take home.

And finally, Vin Debut has added an event space, aptly named “the Spillover Room.” This new addition is adjacent to the main space, can be rented for private parties, and has a lovely selection of food and beverages to choose from.

There are not many streets left in San Francisco where you can go to the movies and enjoy a nice glass of wine with a little bite to eat afterwards. We are lucky that we can still do this in our neighborhood. So check out Vin Debut and don't forget, there is happy hour Monday through Friday from 4-6 PM with \$6 wines and \$4 beers.

Vin Debut is located at 9 West Portal Ave. at Ulloa and is open Wed-Sat 4pm-12am, Sun-Tue 4pm-10pm. Their phone number is 415-987-0414.

Tips on When to Contact 311

311 is improved and has expanded its web-based services. This San Francisco resource for requests and complaints covers a variety of City issues including animals, garbage and graffiti, street lighting, sewer issues and flooding, potholes, abandoned vehicles and blocked driveways, to name a few. Additionally, you may

not be aware, but 311 is responsible for seeing that city-owned land is weeded. If you happen to notice that the three medians/triangles in Monterey Heights or the “ivy wall” dividing oncoming traffic on Monterey Blvd. needs some TLC, please call 311 (we will, too!) and they will come rectify the situation. Please visit <http://sf311.org/> for a complete list of services they cover. Of course, you can still always call them at 311 or (415) 701-2311.

Some examples of 311's speedy work in our neighborhood: A vandal spray-painted a portion of the city-owned triangle located at Yerba Buena and Monterey Blvd. We contacted 311 and they removed the spray paint within 48 hours. Furthermore, when we recently reported to 311 the outage of two street light bulbs in our neighborhood, the lights were made functional within 48 hours of reporting the outage. Good Job 311!

Please note that coyote sightings are reported separately to Animal Care and Control at 415-554-9400.

Consider Applying for the Civil Grand Jury

Looking for a way to participate in City and County government? The Civil Grand Jury of San Francisco is a “watchdog” that investigates the operations of San Francisco government, including its departments, agencies, and officers. The Civil Grand Jury consists of 19 members selected randomly from a pool of applicants to serve a one-year term. Each Civil Grand Jury determines, by majority vote, which issues related to the government of the City and County of San Francisco to investigate. Typically, the Jury divides itself into committees, which carry out the investigations and write the reports.

Service is from July 1st to June 30th each calendar year. The entire Civil Grand Jury meets once per week, generally in the late afternoon. Subcommittees meet as needed. Most of the Jury's work takes place during regular business hours. If you are interested in applying for this opportunity, please visit <http://civilgrandjury.sfgov.org/join.html>.
